The minutes below reflect the discussion of the group during the meeting. Any additional information added after the meeting is shown in *italic text*.

- Introductions
- Review of Goals of Committee:
- Create Educational Specifications for AUSD, for each school type
- Purpose is to define a standard for educational program and the required facilities to meet that program at
  each school across the District. This will be used to evaluate each school site's facilities during the Master
  Planning process and identify proposed facility improvements.
- General comments on District Standards for High Schools:
  - o Need a defensible perimeter with gates and a secure core.
  - Security lighting at outdoor spaces is important.

- Security cameras may provide an additional level of security. Monitored cameras provide the
  possibility that an unwanted intruder could be seen before they penetrated the classrooms. Cameras
  can be used after school hours.
- o There are 2 distinctly different High Schools with different priorities Alameda HS and Encinal HS.
- o Currently the district does not provide bussing for high school students.
- Campus's need a more defined point of entry. There is no clear "front door" to the school. Need a clear point of entry. (Typically at Admin.)
  - Egress is a problem with kids exiting campus at various points around the perimeter. This is a safety issue for special ed.
  - Centrally located administration office would be good.
  - Currently not adequate staff parking.
  - Drop off and Pick up traffic patterns are a huge issue. 4 kids have been hit by cars already this school year.
  - Separate area for Special Education bus pick up/drop off. (No general bussing)
  - Having adequate facilities on campus is essential, including Theaters, tracks, football fields,
     Gymnasiums, etc.
  - Need to be able to host a graduation on campus.
  - "Career ready" programs need to be provided for. (shops, robotics, CTE, Culinary, etc.)
  - Student commons space is desired.
  - Numerous meeting spaces are required ranging in size from small conference size (8-10 people) to full class size to multiple class size).
    - Space should be flexible so it can be divided or opened up with acoustically isolating partitions.
    - Require large flexible spaces for dance, P.E., presentations, etc.
    - Open, bright and flexible dining facilities are required.
    - Open to natural light and outdoor gathering areas.
    - Good acoustics.
    - Presentation areas with proper sound and A/V systems.
    - Speed lines and quality food service facilities

# Learning Environment Standards:

- o The future of AUSD should include teaching collaboration opportunities.
- o Flexibility and mobility is seen as an issue related to the "furniture" as much as the architecture.
- Flexible Spaces or teaching suites can allow for a possible return to conventional, single classroom teaching environments should goals change in the future.
- Small, private meeting rooms are needed.
- There should be no "front" to the classroom. Can projectors rotate so that any wall can become the "Teaching wall"?
- Acoustics are important to provide privacy for meetings, sound isolation for special ed and music,
   etc.
